NEW COURSES AT CAHS FOR 2022-2023

Introduction to Esports II

1/2 Credit

Grade 9-12

Prerequisites: Successful completion of Introduction to Esports I

From the North America Scholastic Esports Federation (NASEF), esports is undeniably popular as a digital platform for interaction and entertainment. In an effort to capitalize on interest-based learning, we wanted to capture students where they are with esports. We sought explicit connections with esports and content standards (Next Generation Science Standards, English/Language Arts, International Society for Technology in Education, and Social-Emotional Learning) and have developed curricula for high school students in a variety of learning environments.

Esports curriculum helps develop life skills, the history of gaming, career prospects, and the opportunity to join other schools for competition. These courses are semester courses and introduce students to the foundational concepts, principles, and tools of esports. Any previous education about computers and gaming is beneficial but not required. Course I will be designed to teach the evolution of the gaming industry and career prospects. Course II will become more technical in nature and delve further into the game design.

YEARBOOK I AND YEARBOOK II

Yearbook I 1/2 Credit

Grade 9-12

Prerequisites: Successful completion of 8th grade.

Yearbook II 1/2 Credit

Grade 9-12

Prerequisites: Successful completion of Yearbook I.

Yearbook I and Yearbook II are semester courses geared for students who are interested in the fields of communication, photography, design, marketing, and/or business. Students in this class will be responsible for planning, creating, producing, promoting, and selling the yearbook. Students will learn to work within an organizational structure that includes student editors and strict deadlines. Students will learn the design skills needed to produce the Charleroi Area High School Yearbook. Through this process, students will understand how to use an online software program. Additionally, students will learn skills including how to write captions, select fitting titles and subtitle, take high-quality photos, and edit photos. In Yearbook II, students will gain knowledge on how to manage a business through the financial aspect of creating the yearbook. As an extension of either course, students may sign up to attend events outside of the standard school day in order to obtain pictures.

The courses are semester courses. Yearbook I will be an introductory course designed to teach students how to create the high school yearbook. Yearbook II will be a continuation of Yearbook I with additional responsibilities for the students.

EXPLORING CAREERS

Exploring Careers 1/2

Credit Grade 9-12

Prerequisites: Successful completion of 8th grade.

Exploring Careers takes a unique approach to career planning by using a self-discovery process to match a career area to a student and by equipping students with the tools they need to develop and implement their own personal career plans. Students who successfully complete this course will be more self-confident about taking responsibility for the education and career decisions that affect their lives. This course will assist students in planning for the future as well as preparing for employment.
